Packing suggestions for Cascade Youth Camp

The elevation of Camp Cascade makes nights cool and weather to change rapidly. Please not the following suggestions of what to pack.

Warm clothes AND cool clothes....layers are good.

Jacket and rain poncho/ rain gear

Tennis shoes will protect you from stickery things and rocks. Flip flops are dangerous and not recommended around camp. Please bring sturdy shoes.

PJs suitable for hanging out in

Swim suit and beach towel

Sun screen and sun glasses

Laundry bag

Towel and wash cloth

Shower shoes /flip flops

Personal care items such as toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap and deodorant

Sleeping bag/sheets and blankets

Mosquito repellent

Flashlight and batteries

Reusable water bottle

Note: *All medications need to be given to, or cleared with, the camp nurse and noted on your registration form.*

Do NOT bring

Candy/food/soda pop (attracts critters)

Alcohol/drugs/tobacco (We don't do that stuff)

Weapons of any kind

Fireworks or matches (It costs \$1 million a day to fight a forest fire. You get to pay that bill if you start a fire. This is not included in your camp registration.)

Personal electronic devices such as DVD player, computers. Cell phone and other electronic use are limited to set times. When not in use they will be stored in a secure location.
